TENSION BETWEEN LEGAL AND PR



I. The Legal Perspective



- Attorney-Client Privilege: Protecting the client who might face civil or criminal liability
- Worry about waiver all can be subpoenaed to testify against client, including lawyers as well as PR advisors – and to produce strategy documents
- Worry about conceding facts and admitting to liability (PR advisors may not be up to date on facts or understand complicated legal issues):
 - Conversations with journalists not privileged
 - Documents sent to journalists not privileged
- Worry about not knowing all the facts something comes up later


Therefore: "NO COMMENT" USUALLY BETTER
